CONSULAR CORPS OF TASMANIA REMARKS BY HER EXCELLENCY THE HONOURABLE BARBARA BAKER AC GOVERNOR OF TASMANIA GOVERNMENT HOUSE, FRIDAY 27 SEPTEMBER 2024

May I welcome two new consuls who have joined the Corps this year:

- Mrs Navpreet Kaur, Honorary Consul for India.²

I am sure that the Corps looks forward to working with you and benefitting from your expertise.

Mr Elvio Brianese is unable to join us this evening. However, I would like to acknowledge and thank Elvio for his service. He has recently stepped down from his role as Honorary Consul for the Italian community in Tasmania. *Grazie mille per il tuo servizio*, Elvio.
