They enable learners to not only acquire new skills but also to build self-esteem and confidence.

This theme highlights how families playing, singing and reading together supports children's development of literacy and numeracy skills. By learning together, parents and carers are setting a fine example for their children.

From a personal perspective, and as grandparents, Don and I play and read to our grandchildren. I can report that Lachie (6) loves the *Treehouse* stories, Liam (4) the *Gruffalo* stories, and Sam (2) those perennial favourites, *Peter Rabbit* and *Paddington Bear*. And they sing along to Don's brogue with *Puff the Magic Dragon*!
